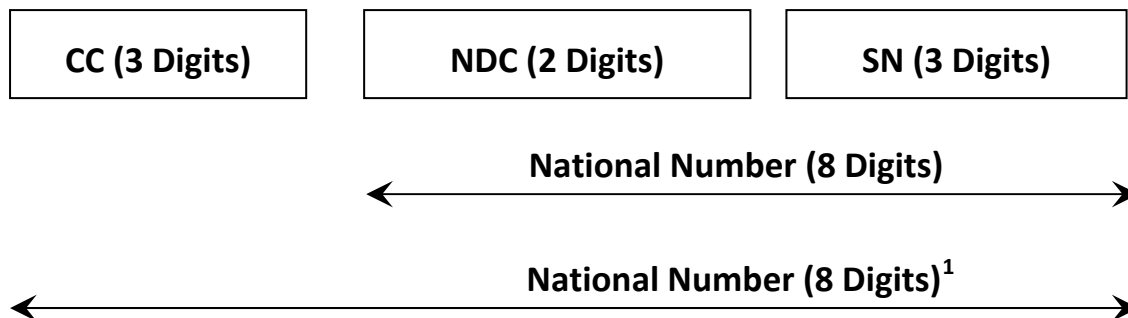


The current national numbering plan is a closed numbering plan that has no area code. Thus, a uniform dialing procedure is applied to all calls. It makes all numbers (except international numbers and short codes) have the same length.
